What is a Health System?

- A health system consists of all organizations, people and actions whose *primary intent* is to promote, restore or maintain health . This includes efforts to influence determinants of health as well as more direct health-improving activities.
- Health system strengthening is improving the 6 WHO building blocks and managing their interactions in ways that achieve more equitable and sustained improvements across health services and health outcomes. It requires both technical and political knowledge and action.

University of Namibia (UNAM) Pre-Service Project



Objectives

- Enhance UNAM MPH degree program through: increased teaching capacity in nutrition, strategic information, and health policy; greater integration of HIV/AIDS content into MPH courses; and sustainability of new course offerings.
- Establish and maintain mechanisms and processes to assure University of Namibia ownership of project results.
- Institutionalize support to MPH students to improve thesis and MPH program completion within the normative time (2–4 years).
- Strengthen institutional capacity of UNAM by increasing faculty development opportunities at UNAM.

Evaluation of Training- Integrated Infectious Diseases Capacity-Building (Uganda)

Develop an integrated curriculum for mid-level practitioners based on the best of existing training programs such as IMCI and designed to encourage advanced clinical reasoning skills.

Measure the impact on clinical performance and health outcomes through a randomized study design, site-level observation and data collection, and population mortality estimates.

Evaluate the cost-effectiveness of the intervention to provide much-needed evidence in support of on-site delivery of training and quality assurance services.
