

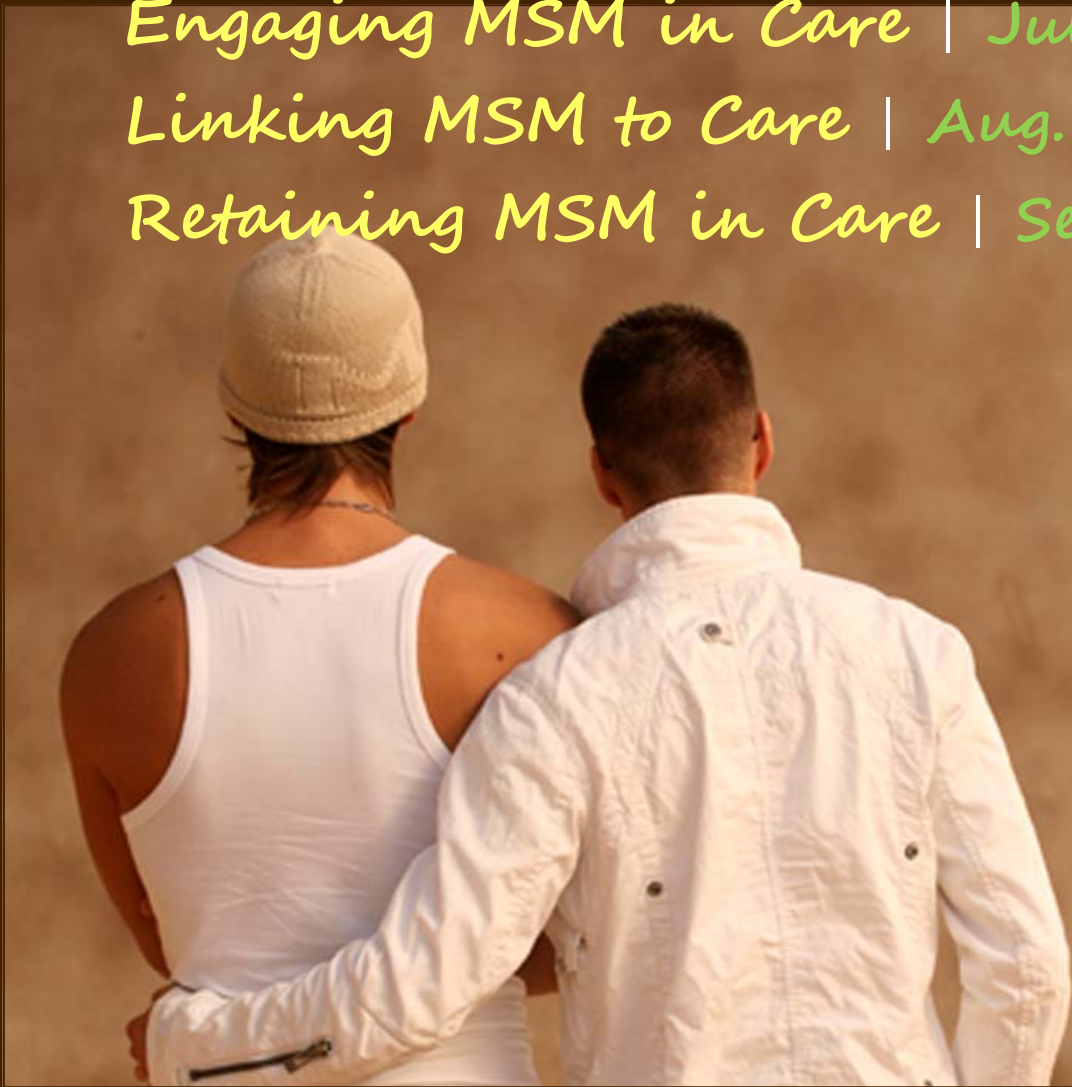

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Marla A. Corwin, LCSW, CAC III

Marla A. Corwin is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and a Certified Addictions Counselor. She is a member of the faculty at the University of Colorado's School of Medicine, and is in her 11th year as Clinical Education Coordinator for the Mountain Plains AIDS Education and Training Center (MPAETC).

Tony Aaron Fuller

Tony Aaron Fuller is a Capacity Building Assistance Specialist at the National Native American AIDS Prevention Center (NNAAPC). Prior to working at NNAAPC, Mr. Fuller was the Prevention Coordinator at from the HIV Alliance in Eugene, Oregon, where he managed the Counseling, Testing and Referral Services program, which offered free HIV testing to high-risk populations; oversaw the county wide Needle Exchange Program, which collected and disposed of used syringes; and managed a community outreach program that included the CDC Intervention "Community Promise," a peer-based HIV education and prevention strategy.

Arman Lorz

Since 1995, Mr. Lorz has been a trainer and facilitator of guided bilingual group discussions, focus groups, and training activities for young adults in the behavioral change process in Mexico and in the United States. Mr. Lorz has expanded his practical experience to include working with populations of different ages and risk behaviors including youth, (MSM) of all ages, male and female high-risk heterosexuals, and people and partners living with HIV. Mr. Lorz has a broad understanding of risk behaviors and risk reduction strategies, particularly among Latino populations.

Eric O. Reece, MSW

Eric Reece is a community training specialist at UT Southwestern in Dallas Texas, where he coordinates a unique HIV/AIDS prevention program that focuses on increasing the leadership capacity of African American MSM in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. Before moving to Dallas, Mr. Reece was an Advocacy Coordinator for Living Affected Corporation in Little Rock Arkansas. Also, Eric served as Executive Director of the Arkansas Equality Network; founding board member of the Center for Artistic Revolution; and advisory board of Lucie's Place- Arkansas' first LGBTQ youth homeless shelter.

Mark Thrun, MD

Dr. Thrun is the Medical Director of the Denver Prevention Training Center, Director of HIV Prevention and STD Control for Denver Public Health, and Assistant Professor of Medicine at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. Dr. Thrun's primary research interests include acute and early HIV infection, the immunology of HIV, and the prevention and diagnosis of HIV infection. He is also actively involved in community planning for HIV services and policy development. Dr. Thrun has recently developed a prevention curriculum for HIV care providers designed to increase the frequency and efficacy of their risk-reduction discussions with patients.
