



- Document:
 - initial actions taken
 - interim measures to adjust
 - initial, interim and final outcomes
- Use to:
 - report interim and final status to funder
 - support need for additional resources
 - support amendments / enhancements

- Share:
 - with partners to gain buy in and improve responsiveness
 - with leadership to show status and assess timeline
 - actions taken along the way to adjust, adapt and revise
 - work completed
- Document:
 - short-term, process improvements, interim and final outcomes
