

Special Presentation: DoxyPEP update

Lindley Barbee, MD MPH; Chief Medical Officer, DSTDP, CDC

Dr. Lindley Barbee is an infectious diseases physician and a public health practitioner with expertise in sexually transmitted infections. She is currently the Acting Chief Medical Officer in the Division of STD Prevention at CDC. Before joining DSTDP, Dr. Barbee served as infectious diseases faculty at the University of Washington and as the Medical Director for the Public Health – Seattle & King County STD Clinic for 10 years. Her work incorporates research, clinical practice and public health program implementation for STIs/HIV.

Stephanie Cohen, MD, MPH; Director, STI and HIV Prevention and Control, San Francisco Department of Public Health

Stephanie Cohen, MD, MPH is the Director of HIV/STI Prevention Section at the San Francisco Department of Health. She is an assistant professor at UCSF in the division of HIV, infectious diseases and global medicine, and is an HIV primary care provider. Her research focuses on using implementation science to guide the translation of STI and HIV prevention research into clinical and public health practice. She was a co-investigator and site PI for the “DoxyPEP study”, a randomized controlled study of doxycycline PEP to prevent STIs. She attended Harvard Medical School, and completed training in internal medicine and infectious diseases at the University of California, San Francisco and has a Master’s in Public Health from the University of California, Berkeley.

Kenneth H. Mayer, MD

Dr. Mayer is a physician who trained in the Harvard programs in Internal Medicine at Beth Israel Hospital and in Infectious Diseases at Brigham and Women’s Hospital. He is currently a Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, a Professor in Global Health and Population at the Harvard TC Chan School of Public Health, and is an Attending Physician at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center. Starting in 1994, he has been a site Principal Investigator of NIH-funded clinical trials units, focusing on bio-behavioral HIV prevention research (HIVNET, HVTN, MTN, ATN), and is a member of the scientific leadership of HPTN. He has co-authored more than 1000 peer-reviewed publications, co-authored the first text on AIDS for the general public and has co-edited 5 academic texts. He has served on the governing boards of amfAR, HIVMA and IAS, is an Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of the International AIDS Society, and is a member of the PEPFAR Scientific Advisory Board.
